Baby with “unperforated anus with recto vaginal fistula, in desperate need for surgery”



During the course of my activities as a contracted Ethiopian physician on the Village of Hope Medical Expedition, I saw an impoverished Ethiopian mother and starving baby. She has given birth to a female child with congenital unperforated anus with recto vaginal fistula which is debilitating to the child, as well as to her mother and family. She came to Village of Hope with great hope of treatment, but the kind of major surgery she will require can only be done in Addis Ababa. I have seen her with great sorrow and recommend her to be helped to resolve her problem. I consulted with a prominent pediatrician in Addis (*Dr. Adane – Chair of the Village of Hope, National Governing Council*), and he felt the little girl could be treated surgically in Addis Ababa and her debilitating problem resolved for around \$5,000.

Village of Hope's Kersa Illala Cooperative Dairy gains momentum

We visited the cooperative dairy in Debra Zeit and got their commitment to assist us in the development of our dairy in Kersa in any way they could. We are also applying to Virginia State University for assistance from their dairy development team in Ethiopian and Land'O Lakes has committed to do whatever they can to facilitate our growth and success.

The Debra Zeit commitment is especially important because of the unbelievable success they have had in the last 6 years with their coop dairy. They started with 34 members, 400 cows, and 3,400 Birr in capital 6 years ago and now have 950 members, 3,300 cows and capital of 1,761,305 Birr and producing close to 1,500,000 liters of milk a year. They accomplished everything without debt of any kind, and are now building their own processing/distribution facility, which hopes to help us be as successful as they are, in order to collect and market the milk of the Kersa coop dairy,
